About Wise Children

Wise Children is an international touring theatre company, based in the South West. Led by award-winning director Emma Rice, we make ground-breaking and accessible work with exceptional artists which we tour across the UK and the world. Alongside shows we run the Wise Children Training Programme, a unique professional development programme training the next generation of diverse, independent theatre makers.

Our Artistic Director Emma Rice is amongst the UK's best known and loved theatre directors. Her celebrated 30-year career has included being Artistic Director of Cornish theatre company Kneehigh and of Shakespeare's Globe, London. In 2019, she received the [UK Theatre Award for Contribution to British Theatre](#): *'Theatre maker Emma Rice was presented with this special award in recognition of the unique, innovative and socially relevant work that she has created and directed all over the country, and her significant influence on the contemporary theatre landscape.'* In 2022, she was named one of [Sky Arts](#) '50 most influential British artists of the last 50 years'.

Wise Children has been a nomadic organisation but, since we launched, we have been on the hunt for a home. Last year we found it, taking over an old church in Frome, Somerset, which we have named The Lucky Chance. It is a permanent base for the company where we can experiment, rehearse, share new work, and run the Wise Children Training Programme from.

About The Wise Children Training Programme

The Wise Children Training Programme is a flexible training, designed to nurture the next generation of fearless, independent theatre makers. Led by Emma, and the award-winning creatives she works with, the programme focuses on two key elements of the way Wise Children works – ensemble storytelling and collaborative devising – and uses these to unlock creativity in each student.

The programme includes Taster' workshops, week-long residencies, mentoring and Traineeships: paid positions on Wise Children shows. We've also got an active Alumni network, through which we continue supporting students after their training.

The programme is also designed to address inequalities in access to arts training in the UK, where cost, knowledge, networks and the structure of traditional courses can all be a barrier to participation. We work closely with a range of partners, including the theatres we tour to, reaching varied communities through their existing networks and youth programmes. All places free, and we offer additional support for travel, accommodation, living and/or other access costs.

Wise Children's Summer Open Residency 2024

Venue: The Lucky Chance, Frome, Somerset

We'll be inviting twelve outstanding performers to join us at our new venue in the beautiful market town of Frome, Somerset for our 2024 residential course, Wise Children's Summer Open Residency.

Perfectly observed performance, soul melting music and flawless ensemble work are the hallmarks of a Wise Children show. We're looking for creative performers interested in finding out how we do it!

Led by the Wise Children directing team, the Summer Open Residency is a week-long performing course which will include acting, singing, dancing, puppetry, and more, as you learn to create playful, ensemble, music-filled theatre in the style of Wise Children. It's our favourite way to meet new (or new to us) performers.

We're looking for performers aged 18+ who are serious about working in the industry. No professional training is needed, but all students will need to be able to perform, sing and move confidently – so we're expecting most applicants will have at least some previous performing experience. There is no upper age limit for this opportunity. You may have joined the industry recently, wanting to brush up on your skills or returning after taking some time out.

We are committed to equal opportunities and actively welcome candidates from all backgrounds. To ensure our training is as accessible as possible, support with travel, accommodation, subsistence and access requirement (including childcare) is available.

The video should contain the following material and be no longer than two minutes.

(Due to the high volume of applications, we receive we won't be able to watch beyond the two-minute mark).

- **An introduction:** Who are you, and why do you want to do the residency?
- **A turn that incorporates all your skills:** This could include acting, singing, movement, playing an instrument, standing on your head, a second language... everything you could bring to an ensemble.

Application deadline: 9am on Monday 17th June 2024.
